- □ ¹Among the egregious sins of David from which great difficulties came. Notice from chapter 13 on how David's house was torn apart. Sin has consequence s, even if forgiven.
- □ ²This passage is parallel to Psalm 32 and 51.
- □ ³See Psalm 18 which is nearly identical.
- □ Key verses: 11:27b.
- □ Food for thought: Why does the Bible contain verses like 2 Sam 23:20?
- □ Notice 2 Sam 6:1-7 where the Ark is carried on a wagon; Num 7:1-9 and 4:4-6 clearly say that the Ark and the other furniture of the tabernacle was to be carried by hand by the Kohathites, and not on wagons.
- □ Notice the importance of 2 Sam 7 (Davidic covenant) throughout the rest of history
