OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

OUR STAFF

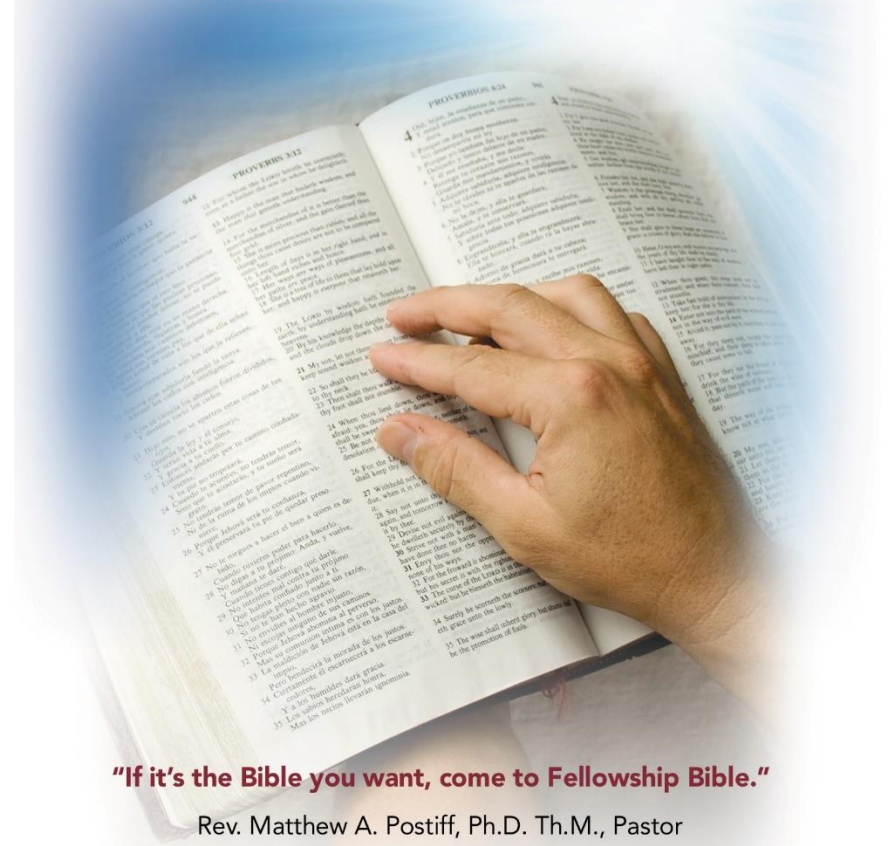
Ben Carnes and Jon Snoeberger are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church. Jansen Lorch ministers as pastoral intern.

DEVOTIONAL READING - The Awesome God of Wonders Job 37:5-16

“In the secret of His presence How my soul delights to hide! Oh, how precious are the lessons Which I learn at Jesus’ side” ~ E. L. Goreh

The thirty-seventh chapter of Job speaks of the wonders of God as displayed in nature. In particular God’s power and presence are evidenced through such natural events as thunderstorms, snowstorms, windstorms, etc. How we need to trust this awesome God in the midst of the storms that are raging around us in our day. In this chapter we shall briefly highlight four precious verses:

1) “Great things doth He which we cannot comprehend” (v. 5). We cannot begin to understand the mysterious workings of our God. “His ways are past finding out” (Rom. 11:33). He works all things, in perfect wisdom, after the counsel of His own will (Eph. 1:11). He does all things well (Mark 7:37).

2) “Stand still, and consider the wondrous works of God” (v. 14). How we need to pause and meditate on the wonderful things that God does for our benefit and for His glory. “Come behold the works of the LORD....Be still and know that I am God” (Psalm 46:8,10).

3) “Dost thou know...the wondrous works of Him which is perfect in knowledge?” (v. 16). “As for God, His way is perfect: the word of the LORD is tried: He is a buckler to all those that trust in Him” (Psalm 18:30). God’s perfect knowledge takes into account every factor and every circumstance in time and in eternity. He makes no mistakes.

4) “...the Almighty, we cannot find Him out: He is excellent in power, and in judgment, and in plenty of justice” (v. 23). From our limited viewpoint, we can never figure God out. We need to simply trust Him, rest in His all-wise plan, and allow God to be God.
