OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

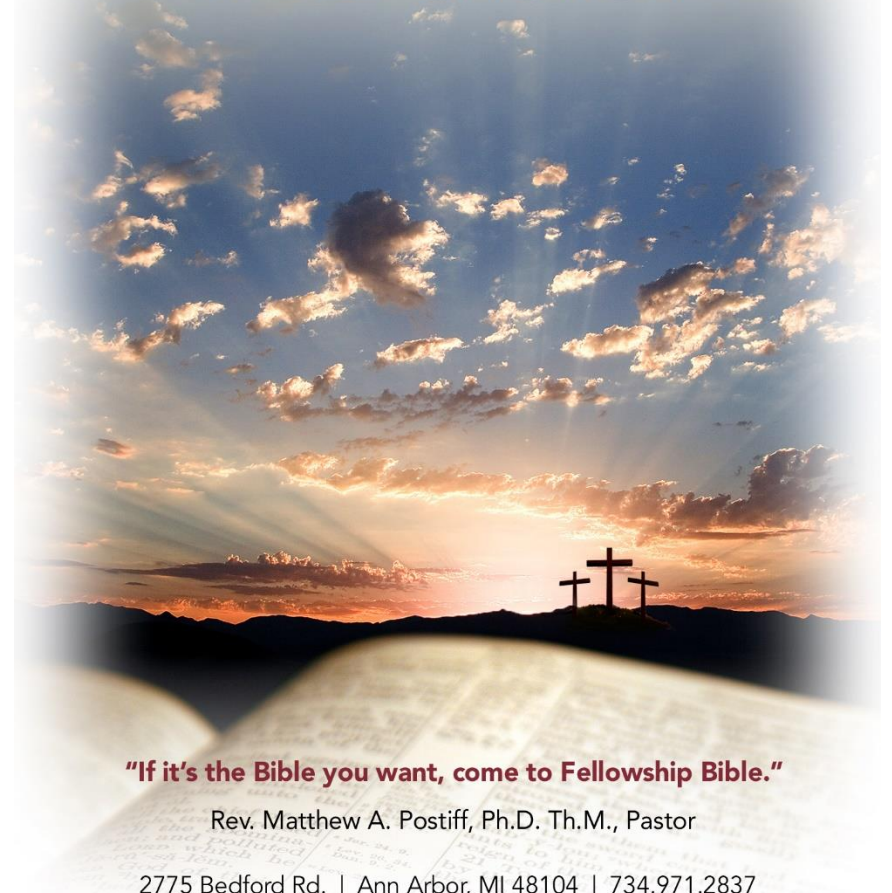
Ben Carnes and Jon Snoeberger are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church.

DEVOTIONAL READING - Do You Believe in Mother? Luke 16:19-31

Utmutato a Lelekneck, Hungarian writer and poet, penned this parable or thought experiment: Two babies were in the womb.

One asked: "Do you believe in life after delivery?"

The other replied, "Why, of course. There must be something after delivery. Maybe we are here to prepare ourselves for our next life." "Nonsense" said the first. "There is no life after delivery. What kind of life would that be?"

The second said, "There will probably be more light than here. Maybe we will walk with our legs and eat from our mouths. Maybe we will have other senses that we can't understand now."

The first replied, "That is absurd. Walking is impossible, and eating with our mouths? Ridiculous! The umbilical cord supplies nutrition and everything we need."
