OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
3. We believe that man was created in the image of God, but he sinned, and thereby all human beings are born with a sin nature which is at enmity with God. Man therefore needs to be reconciled to God, released from slavery to sin, and delivered from God's wrath against sin and the guilt of sin.

5. We believe that Jesus Christ died in our place at Calvary and that His sacrifice is the only ground for forgiveness of sin.
6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

OUR STAFF

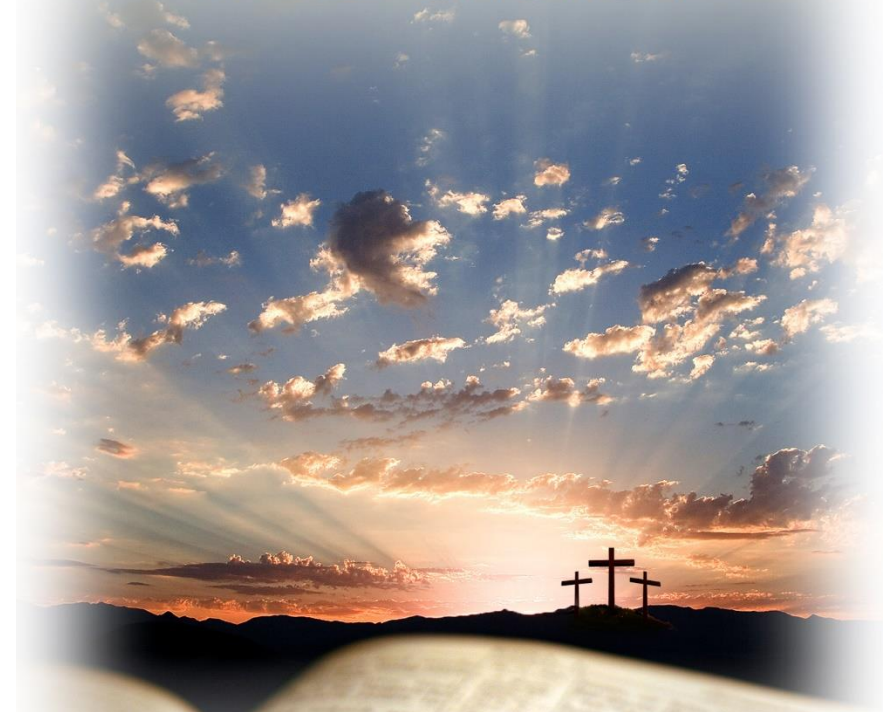
Ben Carnes and Jon Snoeberger are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church. Jansen Lorch is assistant pastor.

DEVOTIONAL READING – Sentence Sermons on Prayer Luke 18:1-8

Sometimes there is much wisdom in few words:

1. Seven days without prayer makes one weak.
2. “I do not pray for a lighter load, but for a stronger back” (P. Brooks).
3. Prayer is the pause that empowers.
4. True prayer is a way of life, not just an emergency route.
5. “I have lived to thank God that all my prayers have not been answered” (J. Inge-low).
6. “When thou prayest, rather let thy heart be without words than thy words without heart” (John Bunyan).
7. God tells us to burden Him with that which burdens us (Psalm 55:22; 1 Pet. 5:7).
8. “Prayer is not learned in the classroom but in the closet” (E. M. Bounds).
9. A lot of kneeling will keep you in good standing.
10. The great tragedy of life is not unanswered prayer but unoffered prayer.
11. To be a Christian without prayer is no more possible than to be alive without breathing.
12. Life is fragile—handle with prayer.
13. More is said about prayer and less is done about it than any other subject in the Bible.
14. Don't ask God for anything until you have thanked God for everything (Phil. 4:6).
15. If you find yourself wearing a “spirit of heaviness” try a “garment of praise.”
16. The time to get your spiritual instruments in tune is early in the morning before the concert of the day begins.

17. One of the secrets of prayer is prayer in secret (spending time alone with God).
18. “Not my will but Thine be done”—whatever, wherever, whenever, however!
19. Real, effective, secret prayer will soon become evident in our public conduct.
20. Turn care into prayer.
