OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.

DEVOTIONAL READING: “I Staked Everything”

I will love thee, O LORD, my strength. The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower. I will call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised: so shall I be saved from mine enemies. The sorrows of death compassed me, and the floods of ungodly men made me afraid. The sorrows of hell compassed me about: the snares of death prevented me. In my distress I called upon the LORD, and cried unto my God: he heard my voice out of his temple, and my cry came before him, even into his ears. – Psalm 18:1-6

David Livingstone only returned from Africa to England twice during his ministry. During his first visit, Livingstone stood before a church in Scotland and told the assembled audience what God had done through his work. Then Livingstone asked, “Would you like me to tell you what supported me through all the years of exile among a people whose language I could not understand and whose attitude toward me was always uncertain and often hostile? It was this, ‘Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.’ On these words I staked everything, and they never failed.”

When we go to God in times of crisis and need, He hears our pleas for help. God never deserts His children. He never abandons us to our own devices. He never says, “I helped you before, and I don't have anything left to help again.” God's hand is ready and willing to act if we come to Him for help. We are never without His help unless we choose to be. The prophet Hanani told Asa, “For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him.” (2 Chronicles 16:9). God never fails to answer His children when they cry out to Him for help.
