OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
3. We believe that man was created in the image of God, but he sinned, and thereby all human beings are born with a sin nature which is at enmity with God. Man therefore needs to be reconciled to God, released from slavery to sin, and delivered from God's wrath against sin and the guilt of sin.

5. We believe that Jesus Christ died in our place at Calvary and that His sacrifice is the only ground for forgiveness of sin.
6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

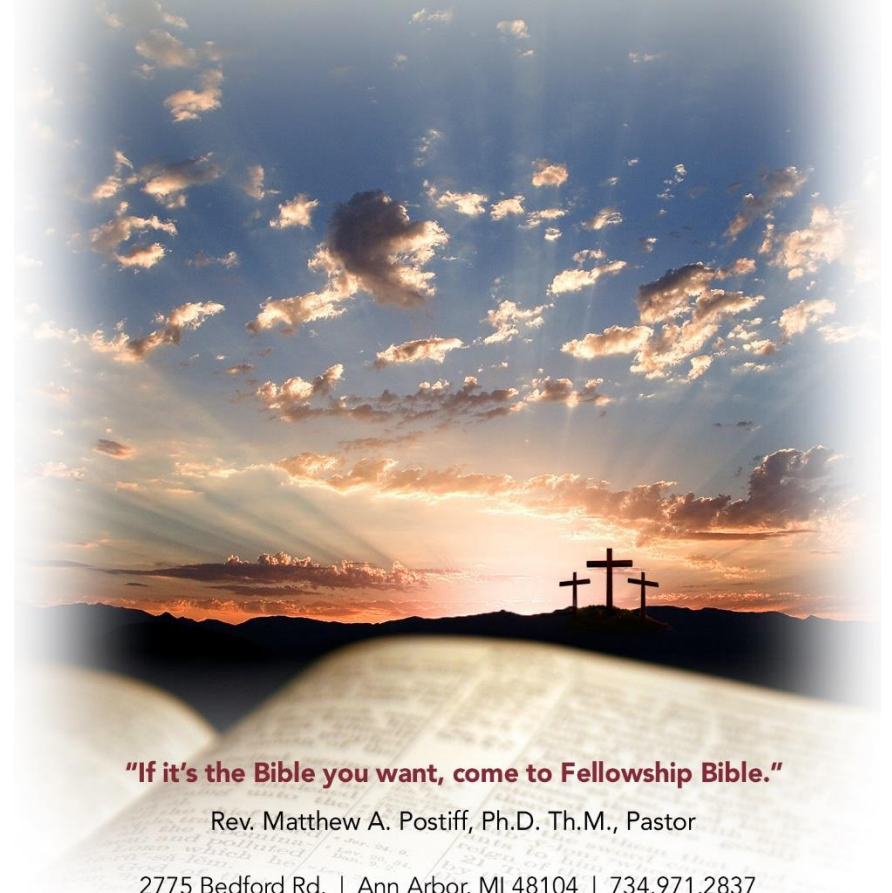

DEVOTIONAL READING

Do We Fear Death Like Others? Luke 2:25-35

Simeon wonderfully demonstrated how completely a believer can be delivered from the fear of death. He was promised he would see the Messiah before he died. After he held the 40-day-old Infant in his arms he said, “Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace, according to Thy word” (Luke 2:29). He did not say, “Oh no! I’ve seen the Messiah and that means I must now die! Woe is me!” Simeon had no problem facing death, and no fear at all. Indeed, he seemed almost eager to leave. For those who have seen Christ (see John 6:40) and embraced Him by faith, death should be no problem.

Those who have welcomed Christ can welcome death. Yet sadly, many believers consider death something to be greatly dreaded. Many Christians are crippled by many phobias with the fear of death being chief among them. As believers in Christ, has God delivered us from the fear of death or has He not?

Are we so attached to the world that the thought of leaving it is terrifying to us? It was not a terrifying thought to Simeon. Nor was it a terrifying thought to Paul. He said “to die is gain,” and “to depart and be with Christ is far better” (Phil. 1:21,23)! To Paul being “absent from the body and present with the Lord” was not a frightening thought (2 Cor. 5:8). David rejoiced in God’s goodness and mercy and knew that he would dwell in the house of the LORD forever (Psalm 23:6). Are we being a good testimony to the unsaved all around us who are so fearful of death or are we just as fearful as they are?

As George Whitefield said, “We (believers) are immortal until our work is done!” Jesus said that believers will never die (spiritually). “Believest thou this?” (John 11:25-26). ~George Zeller: www.middletonbiblechurch.org
