OUR BELIEFS



DEVOTIONAL READING - DISCOVERING GOD IN THE ORDINARY Genesis 41:33-44

"Earth's crammed with heaven, And every common bush afire with God: But only he who sees, takes off his shoes..." ~ Elizabeth Barrett Browning

As we go about our usual duties each day, are we enjoying God and keeping our eyes fixed upon Him? He has wonderful truths to reveal to us about Himself and His Word and about our part in His great plan, as we look to Him and listen for His voice as revealed in the Bible. He most often comes to us in our normal daily routines. Those who are in their proper place, and in the way of duty are most likely to be tuned in to His will and guidance.

On April 12, 1945, when wartime President Franklin Roosevelt died, Harry Truman wrote his mother, "I had hurried to the White House to see the President, and when I got there, I found out I was the President!"

Examples abound in Scripture. One morning, Moses was a shepherd in the desert, but by the end of that day he was a commissioned prophet of God. Joseph began one ordinary day as a prisoner and ended it as a prince of Egypt. David went to check on his brothers and bring them food, and became God's man to slay Goliath. The Virgin Mary, involved in life's ordinary duties, was visited by the Angel Gabriel and told that she would be the mother of the Christ Child. Some unnamed shepherds, "abiding in the field and keeping watch over their flock by night" saw God's glory burst upon the darkness with the angelic pronouncement of Christ's birth (Luke 2:8).

May we be ever faithful in that which is least (Luke 16:15), listening to our Shepherd's voice (John 10:27), meditating on His Word (Ps.119:97,99,105), and anticipating the glorious appearing of our God and Saviour Jesus Christ (Titus 2:13).
