OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.

6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

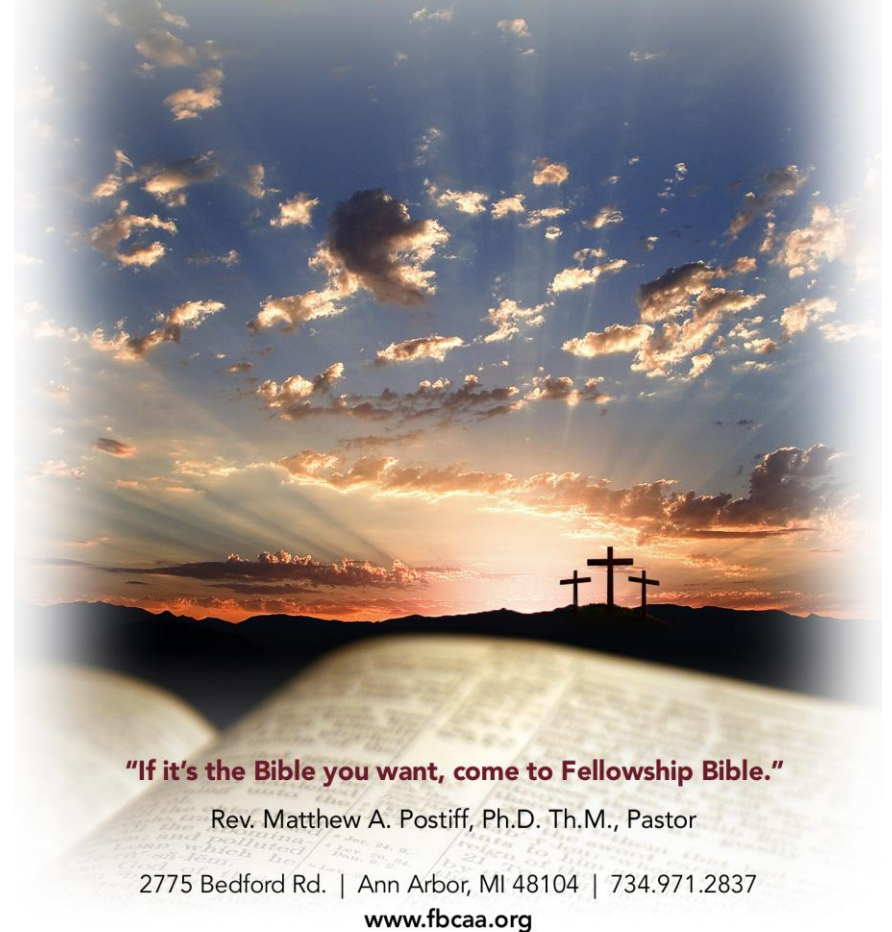
James Widgeon and Ben Carnes are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church. Jansen Lorch ministers as pastoral intern.

DEVOTIONAL READING

In the Old Testament, the prophets spoke of the day of the “visitation of God.” It was seen sometimes as a day of great comfort and rejoicing, and at other times as a day of great distress and judgment.

At the birth of Jesus, God visited the earth. This visitation is celebrated in the Spirit-inspired hymn of Zacharias, in which he twice makes mention of God’s divine visitation (Luke 1:68–69, 78).

The New Testament calls Jesus the “Bishop of our souls.” He is the Bishop Incarnate. His visit to this world has changed the course of history. The initial visit of our heavenly Bishop was cloaked in mystery. He came not as a military general but as a baby in a rock-hewn manger. But He came to care for our souls. He came to see our situation. He came with divine blessing and redemption. He also came with a divine warning.

Our Bishop announced to the world that at some future date He would make a second visit. He promises to appear once more to review His troops. For those who love His coming, His next visit will be an occasion of unspeakable joy and glory. At that visit, the consummation of His bishop’s task will be complete.

For those who ignore the first visit of the Bishop, His second visit will be one of sudden disaster. That will be the day of the Lord, the day Amos described as a day of darkness, with no light in it (Amos 5:18).

Thank God for the unspeakable joy and glory that awaits you in the day of the Lord.

BLAMELESS. 1 Samuel 12:1-5, 20-25 When Samuel was old, he gave an impassioned speech to the Israelites who had wrongly asked for a king like all the other nations. He pointed to his own life and testimony: “I have walked before you from my childhood unto this day. Behold, here I am: witness against me before the LORD...whose ox have I taken? Or whose ass have I taken? Or whom have I defrauded? Whom have I oppressed? Or of whose hand have I received any bribe to blind mine eyes therewith?” (1 Sam. 12:2-3). The people answered, “Thou has not defrauded us, nor oppressed us, neither hast thou taken ought of any man’s hand” (1 Sam. 12:4). The people bore witness to the fact that Samuel was blameless. This does not mean he was sinless, but it means that his outward conduct was so upright that the people who knew him could find no fault.

Today, elders and deacons are to be blameless (1 Tim. 3:2,10). The word “blameless” in 1 Timothy 3:2 means “cannot be laid hold of.” Suppose your enemy wants to hit you over the head with an iron frypan. To do so, he must lay hold of the handle, and if there were no handle, he would have a problem. If an elder misappropriated money, then that would be a handle that could be used against him. A blameless man provides no handle, no outward misconduct that can be used to defame his character. Daniel was a blameless man. His enemies tried to find some fault or corruption or malpractice, but they found none: “[Daniel] was faithful, neither was there any error or fault found in him” (Dan. 6:4). Finding no real crime, they conspired to have him committed by King Darius to the lion’s den for faithfully praying to the true and living God each day! May we imitate this faithful man of God!
