OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

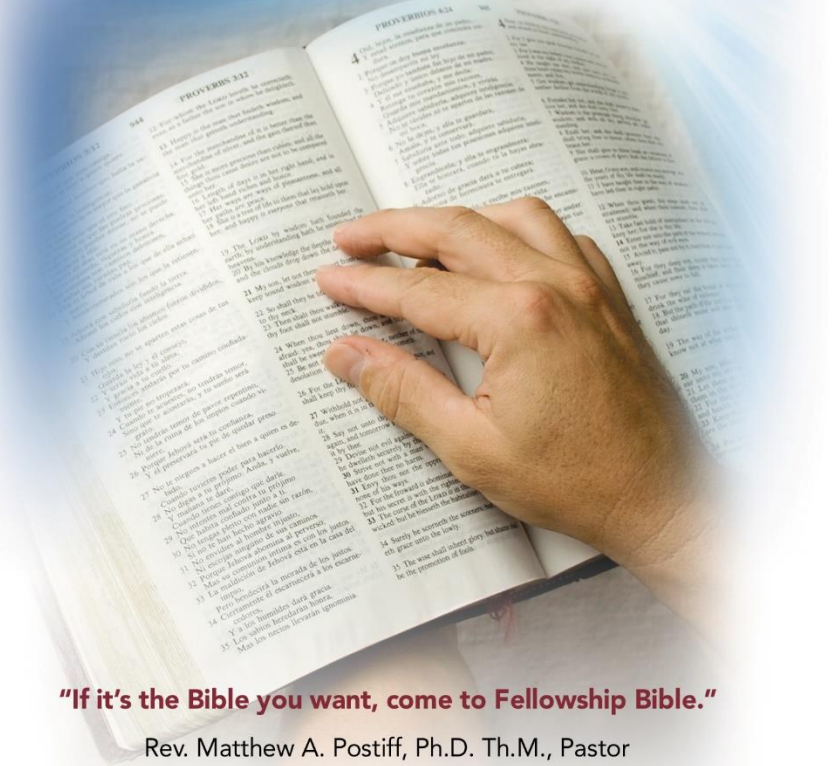
Ben Carnes and Jon Snoeberger are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church. Jansen Lorch is assistant pastor.

DEVOTIONAL READING – Heeding the Warning by Dr. Paul Chappell

Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood. For I know this, that after my departing shall grievous wolves enter in among you, not sparing the flock. Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them. Therefore watch, and remember, that by the space of three years I ceased not to warn every one night and day with tears. - Acts 20:28-31

Probably the most famous horseback ride in American history took place on the night of April 18, 1775. After seeing the two lanterns hanging in the Old North Church of Boston, Paul Revere and William Dawes set out to warn of the British raid. The trip was immortalized by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow in his poem “The Landlord's Tale,” better known by the name “Paul Revere's Ride.” The warning allowed John Hancock and Samuel Adams to escape capture and prepared the Minutemen to confront the redcoats at Concord and Lexington that marked the beginning of the Revolutionary War. If the warning had not been heeded, the results would have been different.

When Paul met with the leaders of the church at Ephesus for the last time, he warned them of the rise of false doctrine, not just from outside the church but even from within. What was true almost two thousand years ago is still true today. There is no shortage of people who claim to be followers of Jesus who are teaching things that are completely opposite of what the Bible says. It is vital that we pay attention to the warnings we have been given, and stay on guard rather than blindly accepting things because the person saying them seems to be nice or has the right title. “Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world” (1 John 4:1). The presence of false teaching demands that we carefully measure everything by the Word of God.
