OUR BELIEFS



DEVOTIONAL READING

"My grace is sufficient for thee." - 2 Corinthians 12:9

If none of God's saints were poor and tried, we should not know half so well the consolations of divine grace. So with the Spirit's work: if it were not on many occasions surrounded with tempestuous waters, we should not know that it was true and strong; if the winds did not blow upon it, we should not know how firm and secure it was. The master-works of God are those men who stand in the midst of difficulties, steadfast, unmovable...

"Calm mid the bewildering cry, Confident of victory."

He who would glorify his God must set his account upon meeting with many trials. No man can be illustrious before the Lord unless his conflicts be many. If then, yours be a muchtried path, rejoice in it, because you will the better show forth the all-sufficient grace of God.

As for his failing you, never dream of it—hate the thought. The God who has been sufficient until now, should be trusted to the end.
