OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

DEVOTIONAL READING

"O God, You are my God; early will I seek You..." (Psalm 63:1)

Andrew Murray considered dedicating the first 30 minutes of the day to God as essential to his spiritual well-being. He described it as "the morning watch" saying, "We know of no act attended with larger good to ourselves or others than the formation of an undiscouragable resolution to keep the morning watch and spend the first half-hour of the day alone with God."

The Psalmist David made a similar commitment in Psalm 63:1 when he declared, "early will I seek You." The Hebrew word for *early* might also be translated as "earnestly with priority." Blessing comes when we commit the morning watch to seeking God in His Word with priority and zeal.

Try incorporating memorization as a part of your very own morning watch with the Lord. A key to hiding God's Word in your heart is repetition over time. Doing it first thing in the morning ensures that you are consistently practicing this needed spiritual discipline. Think of the growth in the Lord and knowledge of the Word that could be yours by making memorization part of your devotional time in the morning! – Scripture Memory Fellowship, <https://scripturememory.com/blog/motivation/commit-the-morning-watch-to-god.html>

Make up your spiritual accounts daily; see how matters stand between God and your souls (Psalm 77:6). Often reckonings keep God and conscience friends. Do with your hearts as you do with your watches, wind them up every morning by prayer, and at night examine whether your hearts have gone true all that day, whether the wheels of your affections have moved swiftly toward heaven. – Thomas Watson
