Title: Overview: Public Introduction of John the Baptist and Jesus

Truth: These notes provide a detailed outline of Matthew 3.

Date/Location: Sunday January 24, 2021 at FBC

I. John the Baptist, 3:1-12

- A. Preaching Repentance, 3:1-4
 - 1. The Method John used was Preaching.
 - 2. The Content of John's Message was Repentance.

Reason why repentance is critical: the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

- 3. In Fulfillment of Prophecy, Isaiah 40:3-5.
- 4. Description of John's garb and diet.
- B. Baptizing the Repentant, 3:5-6
 - 1. Many people were responsive to his message.
 - 2. They confessed their sins and were baptized in the Jordan.
- C. Preaching Judgment, 3:7-10
 - 1. Pharisees and Sadducees are called out for their sin.
 - 2. John called them, like everyone else, to repent and then bear fruit from that repentance.
 - 3. John warned them about a false sense of security in their ancestry.
 - 4. Judgment is imminent.
 - 5. Good fruit indicates true repentance.
- D. Pointing to Messiah, 3:11-12. Still in the context of judgment, but highlighting it by introducing the soon to arrive ultimate judge.
 - 1. John's baptism uses water as the medium to indicate an identification with his message of repentance.
 - 2. The Messiah will come with two greater baptisms: one of the Spirit and one of fire.
 - 3. A sorting process will occur in which the Lord will judge the world.
 - 4. "Gathering the wheat into the barn" is an image that reflects salvation.
 - 5. The chaff is a picture of those who reject the Messiah. Their "baptism with fire" is a picture of judgment.

II. Jesus, 3:13-17

- A. Jesus is Baptized by John, 3:13-15
 - 1. Jesus travels to the Jordan to be baptized.
 - 2. John hesitates to baptize Jesus.
 - 3. Jesus insists based on the need to fulfill all righteousness.
- B. Jesus is Affirmed by God, 3:16-17
 - 1. The Spirit of God came down upon Jesus.
 - 2. God the Father indicated His pleasure in Jesus. Nothing else in the world but Jesus was "very good" like Genesis 1:31.
 - 3. The Trinity is very clear here.

Conclusion

In this way, Matthew describes the introduction of John and Jesus, *and their message*, to the Jewish people and in turn to the world.
