OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
3. We believe that man was created in the image of God, but he sinned, and thereby all human beings are born with a sin nature which is at enmity with God. Man therefore needs to be reconciled to God, released from slavery to sin, and delivered from God's wrath against sin and the guilt of sin.

6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

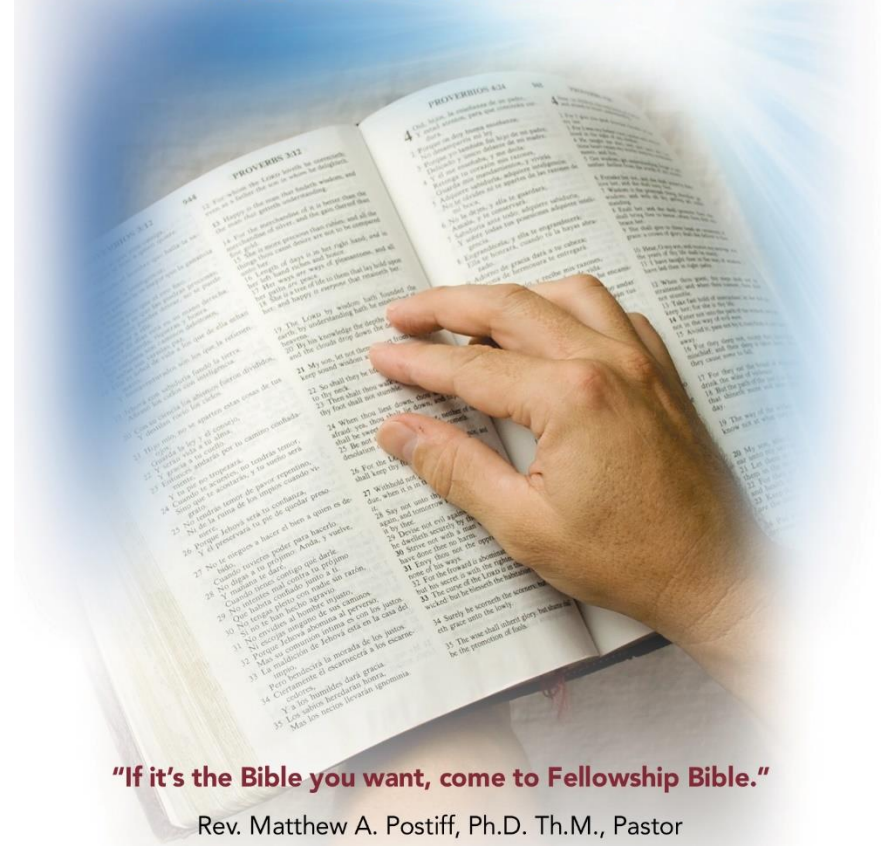
Ben Carnes and Jon Snoeberger are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church. Jansen Lorch is assistant pastor.

DEVOTIONAL READING – The Chief End of Man Psalm 37:1-11

“Man’s chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy Him forever” (Westminster Shorter Catechism, 1643-1648). “End” indicates a goal or result that one should seek to achieve.

God has put us on Planet Earth that we might bring glory to Him and enjoy Him. To “enjoy” means “to take delight in, to find pleasure in.” God Himself is to be our source of pleasure and delight and satisfaction.

Notice the word “joy” embedded in the word “enjoy.” Our joy is to be in God our Savior: “Rejoice in the Lord always and again I say rejoice” (Phil. 4:4). Man’s chief disappointments come whenever he seeks to find joy and satisfaction and fulfillment apart from God. “Delight thyself also in the LORD; and He shall give thee the desires of thine heart” (Ps. 37:4). Habakkuk knew the secret: “Yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will joy in the God of my salvation” (Hab. 3:18).

The man or woman who enjoys God will also take great delight in God’s will, as exemplified by the perfect Man, Christ Jesus: “My meat [food] is to do the will of Him that sent Me” (John 4:34). “I delight to do Thy will, O my God” (Ps. 40:8).

God’s will is expressed in God’s Word, and thus the man or woman who enjoys God takes great delight in the Holy Scriptures: “I will delight myself in Thy statutes: I will not forget Thy Word” (Ps. 119:16). “Thy testimonies are my delight” (Ps. 119:24). “I will delight myself in Thy commandments, which I have loved” (Ps. 119:47). “Thy statutes have been my songs in the house of my pilgrimage” (Ps. 119:54). “O how love I Thy law! It is my meditation all the day” (Ps. 119:97). “More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb” (Ps. 19:10).
