OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
3. We believe that man was created in the image of God, but he sinned, and thereby all human beings are born with a sin nature which is at enmity with God. Man therefore needs to be reconciled to God, released from slavery to sin, and delivered from God's wrath against sin and the guilt of sin.
4. We believe in Christ's virgin birth, physical bodily resurrection, ascension, and present intercession for us.
5. We believe that Jesus Christ died in our place at Calvary and that His sacrifice is the only ground for forgiveness of sin.
6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

DEVOTIONAL READING – Laughing At the Future (Deuteronomy 9:1-9)

“She shall rejoice in time to come” (Prov. 31:25b). This word "rejoice" is a Hebrew word meaning "laugh." It is used in Ecclesiastes 3:4--"A time to weep, and a time to laugh." In Psalm 37:12-13 we learn that "the LORD shall laugh [same word] at him (the wicked); for He seeth that his day (of judgment) is coming." The virtuous woman will laugh at "time to come," a clear reference to the days ahead or the future. She will laugh at the future. Just as the ant or squirrel stores away food for a future time, so the godly woman, by her diligent labor, makes ample preparation for the coming days. She works today so as to not worry tomorrow. The godly woman can laugh at the future because she knows that the future cannot hurt her. She has made provision for the days ahead, to the best of her ability (Prov. 31:21), and because of her trust in God, she knows that she can face the future with great confidence and optimism.

It is the privilege of every believer in Christ to confidently laugh at the future. We have been guaranteed a bright, eternal future. We have been guaranteed eternal security (John 6:37-40; 10:27-30). We have the sure promise of God that the future ("things to come") cannot separate us from the love of God (Rom. 8:38-39). In fact, in 1 Corinthians 3:22 we learn that we possess the future! It is ours! The future belongs to us. The term "predestination" is used in Romans 8:29 to teach us that God has marked out a glorious future for every believer.

We do not know what the future holds, but we know Who holds the future.

We can laugh with confidence being fully persuaded that in the future God will complete that good work that He began in us (Phil. 1:6).
