OUR BELIEFS



DEVOTIONAL READING

Prayer begets a church-going conscience, a church-loving heart, a church-supporting spirit. It is the praying people, who make it a matter of conscience, to attend the preaching of the Word; who delight in its reading; exposition; who support it with their influence and their means. – E.M. Bounds

Prayer was the pattern of the Church from its very beginning. Acts 1:14 finds the pilot gathering of believers described as "all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication." As the actual initiation of the Church occurs on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2), one of the features noted about that first church was their commitment to prayer (Acts 2:42). Additional examples of the Church's testimony in prayer are readily seen. Church and prayer are inseparably connected.

Any gathering of believers exercising the Biblical function of the Church will always include prayer. In fact, a proper description for the place where followers of God gather as seen through the reference to the temple is the phrase "house of prayer" (Luke 19:46). When one faithfully prays, the companion practice will be a loyalty to the Church.

In the classic passage delineating the activities of the Church as noted in Hebrews 10:19-25, the beginning message alludes to "boldness to enter the holiest" as well as "draw near with a true heart." While these phrases do not refer solely to prayer, "entering the holiest" and "drawing near" certainly convey the ministry of prayer within the framework of the Church.
