OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

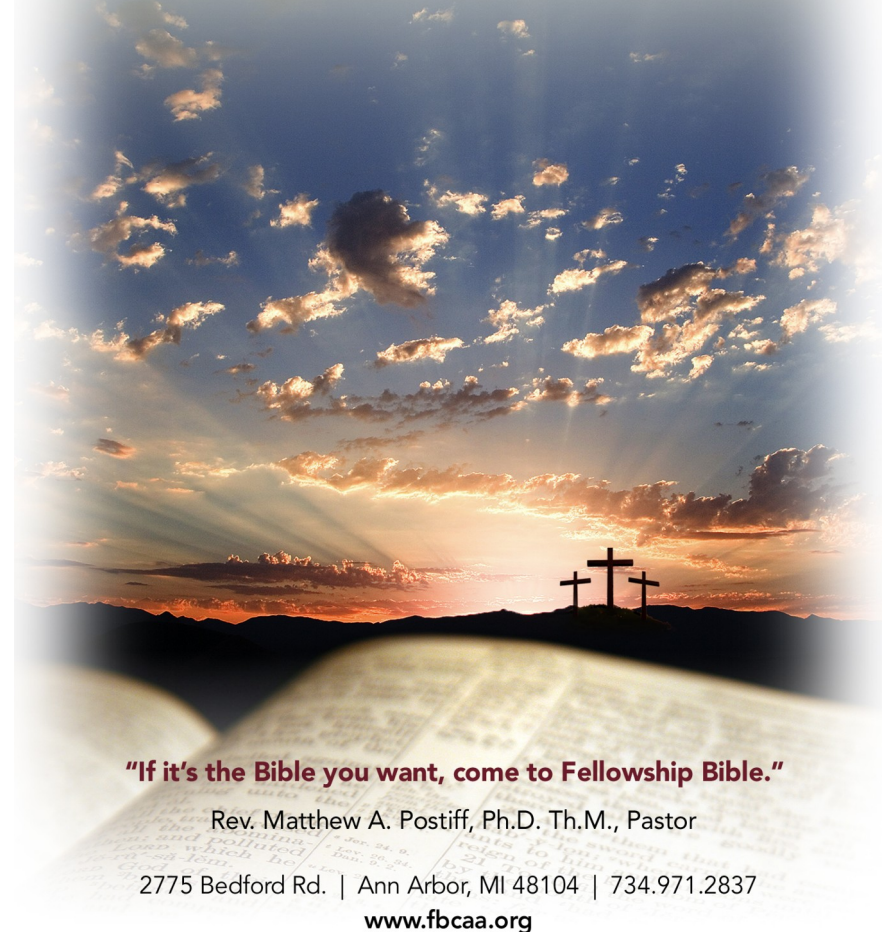
Ben Carnes and Jon Snoeberger are the deacons of Fellowship Bible Church. Pastor Jansen Lorch is assistant pastor.

DEVOTIONAL READINGS – The Ant and the Contact Lens (True Story)

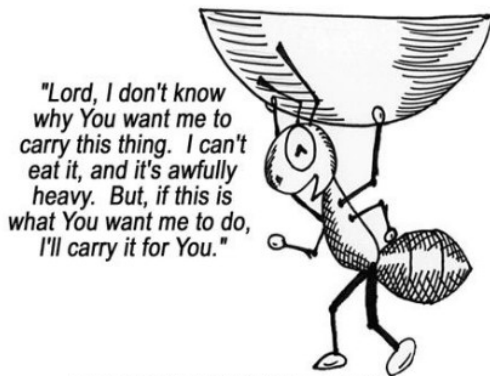
(Psalm 34:11-22)

Brenda was learning about rock climbing. In spite of her fear, she put on the gear and took hold of the rope and started up the face of that rock. As she was hanging on there, whoever was holding the rope up at the top of the cliff made a mistake and snapped the rope against Brenda's eye and knocked out her contact lens.

Obviously, such a small contact lens, having fallen from a rock cliff, would be nearly impossible to find (worse than a needle in a haystack). Here she was, far from home with her sight now very blurry. She was not near any place that could get a new lens for her so she prayed that the Lord would help her find it. She hoped that when she got to the top of the cliff one of the girls might find her lens in the corner of her eye, but alas, it was gone. She then prayed, "Lord, You can see all these mountains. You know where every single stone and leaf is and You know exactly where my contact lens is."

Finally, they walked down the trail to the bottom. As they got there, there was a new party of rock climbers coming along. One of them shouted out, "Hey, you guys, did anyone lose a contact lens?" That it was found was startling enough, but Brenda learned that it was found because an ant was carrying it, moving slowly across a rock! The God of the universe is in charge of the tiniest things!

Brenda's father was a cartoonist. After learning her story, he drew a picture of that ant lugging that contact lens with the words,



"I can do all things through Christ which strengthens me." Phil. 4:13
