OUR BELIEFS



DEVOTIONAL READING - Holy and Fruitful

"I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit. You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you. Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me." - John 15:1-4

Every Christian is called to live a fruitful life, and one of the main prerequisites to fruitfulness is that our lives are clean. We would never choose a glass that was filthy to serve a drink to a guest in our homes. Instead, we select the cleanest one we can find. God is the same way. He wants us to be holy because that is a reflection of His character. "But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy" (1 Peter 1:15-16). He wants us to be holy because it makes us more useful in His service. "Depart ye, depart ye, go ye out from thence, touch no unclean thing; go ye out of the midst of her; be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the LORD" (Isaiah 52:11).

The key to holiness is found in our relationship with Jesus. It is His Word in our hearts and minds that guides us into true holiness. It is possible to fake an outward compliance with rules, at least for a time, but a holy heart can only be produced by spending time abiding in Him. Charles Spurgeon said, "If you think you can walk in holiness without keeping up perpetual fellowship with Christ, you have made a great mistake. If you would be holy, you must live close to Jesus."
