OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

6. We believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, and that all who so believe are eternally saved, transformed, and being sanctified.
7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth for the word's sake, immediately they are offended. And these are they which are sown among thorns; such as hear the word, And the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things entering in, choke the word, and it becometh unfruitful. - Mark 4:16-19

There is no question about the power and effectiveness of the Word of God. It is far more than merely a book, or a collection of ancient wisdom. The Bible is alive and active, able to show us the true state of our condition before God, and providing the means for us to change. “For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discernor of the thoughts and intents of the heart” (Hebrews 4:12). In the pages of Scripture we find all that we need to know God and how He would have us to live.

Yet despite all the power of the Word of God, there are things we can allow in our lives that keep it from doing the work we need it to do in our lives. If our hearts are full of the things of this world, there is no room for the Word to work in us to produce fruit for God's glory. The Bible must be our priority over all the ideas and opinions and traditions we may have. The Pharisees in Jesus' day had the first five books of the Bible committed to memory. Yet they did not benefit from that because they subjugated the Bible to their own ideas. “Making the word of God of none effect through your tradition, which ye have delivered: and many such like things do ye” (Mark 7:13). Only when we heed and follow God's Word can it have its intended impact on our lives.
