OUR BELIEFS



DEVOTIONAL READING - NO MORE SPIES!

(Numbers 13:26-33)

Is my future a heavy weight for me to bear, or a peaceful anticipation? A lady facing a terminal illness shared how the Lord spoke to her through the account of the twelve spies being sent to search out the land of Canaan. She said, "I found I was sending out spies into the future and they always brought back an evil report. So, I have decided NO MORE SPIES! We are just going to live one day at a time fully trusting God." We can easily panic at dire future possibilities that our "thought-spies" bring back. Instead of spies, let us send out God's promises when anxieties about the future enter our minds.

Perhaps we could have a promise in readiness for each apprehension. Examples might be: Natural disaster terrors—Psalm 46:1-3, "God is...a very present help in trouble. Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea...." Persecution concerns—Matt. 5:10, "Blessed are they which are persecuted for right-eousness' sake." Relationship worries—John 16:32, "Ye...shall leave Me alone: and yet I am not alone, because the Father is with Me." Heb. 13:5, "He hath said, I will never leave thee, nor for-sake thee." Financial concerns—Phil. 4:19, "But my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory." Health distresses—2 Cor. 4:17, "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory"; Old age and death worries—Isa. 46:4, "And even to your old age I am He; and even to hoar hairs will I carry you: I have made, and I will bear; even I will carry, and will deliver you."

How wonderful to be confident and childlike in trusting our Heavenly Father and His precious promises.
