OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.
2. We believe there is one only living and true God, eternally existing in three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

DEVOTIONAL READING - The Fear of Man; Genesis 20:1-11

“The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe”
(Prov. 29:25).

Sadly, we are often more afraid of offending men than we are of sinning against God. Abraham feared men and lied about his wife (Gen. 20:2). He could have trusted God, told the truth and enjoyed God’s protection. When the pagan king asked why he had done this, Abraham justified himself by saying, “Because I thought the fear of God is not in this place” (Gen. 20:11). He failed to recognize that the fear of God was absent from his own heart. Like Abraham, instead of fearing God we often fear men. We begin thinking like this:

“What will they think of me? What will they say? Will they get angry? Will they be pleased? Maybe they will see me! I’m afraid of what they might do to me! Will they be upset or offended? Will they still be friendly towards me? What will they want me to say? What will they want me to do? Where will they want me to go? I’m afraid they will not be happy with me! I don’t think they will approve of this! They might frown on my actions! I hope they will really appreciate what I’m about to do!”

This epitomizes the fear of men. What then is the fear of God? To answer this question, simply read the above sentences again and substitute the word “GOD” for the word “they.” You will discover what the fear of God is all about. We are so concerned about the opinion others have of us. How ensnaring and enslaving is the fear of man! May we never allow man’s opinions and pressures to turn us away from right conduct. Obey God no matter what men may say, think or do!
