OUR BELIEFS



DEVOTIONAL READING

It's Hard to Argue Against a Changed Life! Acts 15:1-12

The Jerusalem Council clarified what the true Gospel was. Was salvation by the Law of Moses or was it by the Grace of God? Did Gentiles need to be circumcised and become like Jews in order to be saved? Peter and James provided solid Biblical and doctrinal reasons why salvation was by grace.

Barnabas and Paul provided a different kind of proof. They merely testified of the great work God did among the Gentiles who were confronted with the Gospel of Grace (Acts 15:12). It's hard to argue against lives that have been transformed.

An infidel once lectured in a mining town. He observed the presence of a most intent listener. The man was still wearing his rough, grimy miner's garments, and his massive frame and scarcely concealed muscles bespoke a man of unusual physical strength. The atheist ended his address by saying, "Now I'm sure that I have succeeded in showing you the myth that is called the religion of Jesus Christ." He had hardly finished speaking when the miner rose slowly to his feet. "Sir," he began, "I'm only a working man, and I don't know your fancy word 'myth.' But these people know me. They know that until three years ago, I was the toughest man in town. I had a miserable home. I neglected my wife and children. I cursed, swore, drank all my wages, and whoever withstood me soon felt my fist. Then someone came along and told me of God's love to poor sinners. He showed me Christ dying on Calvary's cross for lost wretches like me. I believed those things you now deny, and through my newfound trust in the cleansing power of the Saviour's blood, my life was changed. These folks can tell you I'm different now."

The argument was won! The evidence was there for all to see!
