### OUR BELIEFS

1. We believe the 66-book Bible is verbally inspired and inerrant in the original writings. We believe that the Bible must be interpreted literally, according to context, history, and grammar. We believe the dispensational approach to the Bible.

7. We believe in the imminent, pretribulational rapture of the church. We believe in the personal, premillennial return of the Lord Jesus to the earth to set up His Kingdom.

It is the heart that makes a man rich. He is rich or poor according to what he is, not according to what he has. – Henry Ward Beecher

The more of heaven there is in our lives, the less of earth we shall covet. – C.H. Spurgeon

Almost every sin has somewhere at its root a desire for something we do not have. While it is not wrong to desire good things, we must always subject our desires to God's commands. Nothing that we desire enough to break His commandments, whether Adam with the forbidden fruit or Achan with the treasures of Jericho or David with Uriah's wife, will lead to real happiness. We should be thankful and grateful that God does good things for others rather than desiring what He has given them more than what He has given us. When we covet anything, it is just a short step to reaching out to grasp it regardless of the consequences. When we covet anything, it will not be long before it replaces God in our hearts. Being content with what God has given guards our hearts from the poisonous effects of covetousness. – Paul Chappell

Covetousness – the evil desire for something belonging to another – is one of the most deeply rooted emotions in the human heart. The Apostle Paul, who as a Pharisee could speak of his faultless outward observance of God's Law (Philippians 3:6), is finally exposed as a sinner by the command, “You shall not covet” (see Romans 7:7-8). He could refrain from stealing but he could not of himself refrain from coveting. – Jerry Bridges

“I will never leave you nor forsake you.” If God really means that, then I don't need to crave after money as the source of my security and identity and pleasure. I can find all that and

more in the enjoyment of intimacy with the God who promises never to leave! The bondage to money and what it can do for us is only broken by believing that God can do far more. Money makes a promise. So does God. The question is: Whom will you believe? – Sam Storms
